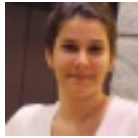


Find your bike

HOW TO RECOVER A STOLEN BIKE?

With the recent recession, crime rates have soared and bicycle theft has increase in 40%, since 2008. Bikes are an easy target and difficult to identify.

But if you got your bike stolen, you have some ways to find it...

- 1** Report it on BikeRegister.ie database, and your bike details will be storage for future use of Gardai. They catalogue all the recovered bikes, so you can look online for yours too. But do it soon, because not collected items end up in a Garda auction.
- 2** Another way to find your stolen bike is looking for it on street markets, like the one at North Cumberland Street in the inner city on Saturday mornings.
- 3** You can also look online sales websites like eBay and BuyandSell.ie. But do it quickly because thieves seek to sell stolen bikes as soon as possible.
- 4** If you try all the previous alternatives and have not find your bike yet, share the information of your stolen bike on social networks like Facebook and Twitter, or even on bike groups.

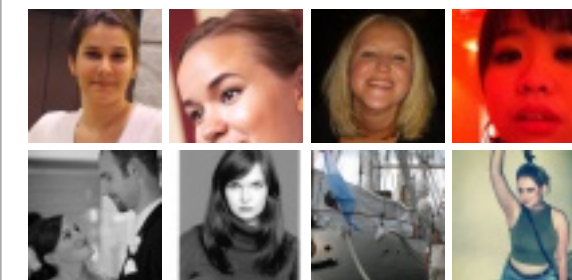
